Also Needed: HART™ Working Table, HART™ Drill Bit Set, Speed Square, and Brad Nailer



Battery Tip: A 4.0 Ah battery is recommended to be paired with high amp draw tools for maximum efficiency.



Lumber Cut List

Description	Board*	Cut to	Qty
		15"	2
		3"	2

^{*}Depending on the size of your project, your cuts might be bigger or smaller.

Assembly Instructions

Step 1

Measure and cut two pieces of your lumber to 15".

Step 2

Measure and cut two pieces of your lumber to 3".

Step 3

Using your dog dishes, center and mark your two circles to cut. Find your spacing and trace your dishes. Then measure in half an inch and trace a smaller circle. This will be your cut line. (Your cut out must be smaller than your dish so it holds your dish properly.)

Step 4

Using your drill and a large drill bit, drill a hole through the center of your marked circle. This is so you can insert your jigsaw.

Step 5

Using that drilled hole, insert jigsaw and carefully cut out your circles.

Step 6

Use your orbital sander with a high grit sanding disc on it to sand smooth.



Step 7

Use a sanding block to sand the inside of the circles.

Step 8

Use wood glue to assemble your box.

Step 9

You can use Brad nails to secure, but not necessary.

Step 10

Stain stand using a tag and stain of choice.

Step 11

Once stain has dried, coat with polycrylic.
