PROJECT PLAN

Finished Dimensions: Varies based on Desired Size


Skill Level: Intermediate


Materials

Item	Qty
Pegboard sheet	one 2 x 4 (but you can use larger if you'd like)
Wood for the frame	2 pieces
Chain or a rope	3 ft of chain is what I used
Brad nails and screws/hooks	8 brad nails & 2 hooks with 2 screws each
Wood glue	A little to attach the frame
Paint of your choice	I used grey chalk paint for the frame

* Board Dimensions are "nominal". Actual dimensions are smaller due to lumber industry standards. Cuts are actual length.

** Starting grit will depend on board surface condition, a rough surface will require starting with a coarse grit first.

 Grit is measured in the coarseness of the particles on the sandpaper. The lower the grit number, the coarser the paper. Heavy sanding would require 60 to 80 grit, medium sanding would require 120 to 220 grit, and finish sanding would require 320 to 400 grit. Super fine sanding would be 600 grit and higher.

 A select/premium board or plywood comes with a smoother surface finish. It is clear or has very few tight knots, and it will have straight and sharp edges. This grade of wood pairs well with other boards or panels better and requires less time to sand and finish.

 Battery Tip: A 4.0 Ah battery is recommended to be paired with high amp draw tools for maximum efficiency.

Assembly Instructions

Step 1

Purchase all the materials needed.

Step 2

Start by measuring the pegboard to the size you want and mark where to cut.

Step 3

Using a jigsaw, cut the excess.

Step 4

Measure the frame and mark where to cut.

Step 5

Using a jigsaw, cut the frame.

Step 6

Sand all the edges.

Step 7

Using wood glue and brad nails, attach the frame to the pegboard.

Step 8

After the wood glue has dried, paint the frame in the color of your choice.

Step 9

Using a driver, attach the chain or a rope to the pegboard where it meets the frame for extra security.

Step 10

Add any pegboard attachments and accessories you want.

Step 11

Enjoy your new organized crafter station.
