Battery Tip: A 4.0 Ah battery is recommended to be paired with high amp draw tools for maximum efficiency.

# Assembly Instructions

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## Step 1

Gather materials, your HART tools, and charged batteries! Start by using the Multi-Tool to cut out a long oval shape. This will be the face. It should be longer/tipped at the top and bottom.

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## Step 2

Cut out a witch nose shape and a scarecrow nose shape. We made the witch nose a bit bumpy, and the scarecrow nose rounded (similar to an upside-down candy corn shape), for a whimsical look. However, these can be shaped in any way you'd like! Cut out wobbly-looking rectangles for the hat brims. You'll need 2 – one for each side of the face.

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## Step 3

Use the sanders to smooth out rough spots and the edges of the wood.

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## Step 4

Using the drill, screw the pieces in place. For the witch nose, add a dowel instead of a screw. This way, the nose can be bent down when you'd like to switch the face around for the scarecrow side to show.

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## Step 5

Use a patching material to fill in the holes where the screws are.

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## Step 6

Paint both sides however you'd like.

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## Step 7

Add small details with paint (eyes, mouth, eyebrows, etc.)

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## Step 8

Add hay for the hair, and any other material you'd like to add depth or detail.
