



## **Reclaimed Wood Ghosts**

# PROJECT PLAN



#### Materials

Item	<b>Qty</b>
Reclaimed Wood (fence panels, barnwood, etc) OR new lumber	5 (depending on design preference)
Hinges & screws	8 (depending on design preference)
Old knobs, handles, chains, etc. (otptional) & screws	1 (depending on design preference)
Black and white paint (or another color of choice	
Paint Brush	1
Black Marker	1

### Tools Used



Battery Tip: A 4.0 Ah battery is recommended to be paired with high amp draw tools for maximum efficiency.

## Assembly Instructions

#### Step 1

Cut the boards to the desired length.

#### Step 2

Sketch the desired ghost head and face. No need for perfection – the messier, the spookier!

#### Step 3

Drill pilot holes in the eyes and mouth (to be used as starter holes for the jigsaw cuts).

#### Step 4

Cut out eyes, mouth, and head shape with the jigsaw.



#### Step 5

Lightly sand the cut areas and any other areas of board, as needed.



#### Step 6

Roughly brush on paint (the more rustic you apply the paint, the spookier it looks).

#### Step 7

When the paint is dry, sand off the edges of the boards, as desired, to create a rustic look.

#### Step 8

Attach the ghosts together with hinges. Note: all boards do not have to hinge. You can attach some of them together with metal straps, pieces of scrap wood, old handles, etc. Be sure that a few of the boards hinge if you would like the finished project to stand on its own. If you create a piece that does not hinge at all, you can always lean it up against a wall!

#### Step 9

Attach old knobs, chains, etc. as desired, to "dress up" the ghosts.

#### Step 10

Enjoy your spooky, fun creation!:)
